Perspectives and Strategies for International Educational Exchange in Europe and the World

The Council on International Educational Exchange (CIEE) announces its 45th Annual Conference on International Educational Exchange.

The choice of this year's theme reflects the awareness that with the rapid changes in the political, economic and social conditions in the eastern and the western hemispheres, the field of education, and especially international educational exchange, faces bigger challenges than ever.

In this period of flux the CIEE conference proposes to examine, discuss, and move ahead in key areas of concern. Curricular and financial aspects as well as more political questions such as the implications of globalization and the worldwide trend towards mass education will be focused on.

Prospects, perspectives, and initiatives in international educational exchange with North and South America, Africa, Asia, and with all parts of Europe including the former USSR will be emphasized in close to 50 workshops, panel and plenary sessions. In addition, there will be an "International Information Market" with dozens of exhibitors, and "Update" sessions on developments in Europe, the USA, and Asia.

The CIEE conference is the principal annual meeting of representatives from 240 universities, colleges and educational exchange organizations from America, Europe, Asia, and Australia that presently make up the CIEE membership. The conference is also open to non-members, thus allowing participants to interact extensively with key educators, administrators, and government representatives from throughout the world.

Honorary Chairman of this year's conference will be Senator (Ret.) J. William Fulbright, Honorary Chairman of the CIEE.

Robert Woodbury, Chancellor of the University of Maine System and Chairman of the Board of the CIEE will be the Acting Chair.

The German Federal Minister of Education, Prof. Dr. Rainer Ortleb, has kindly assumed official patronship of the conference.

CONFERENCE VENUES

The main venue is the Congress Center of the Palast Hotel, located on Karl-Liebknecht-Straße, on the banks of the Spree river, directly opposite the impressive Berliner Dom (Berlin Cathedral) and, on the other side of the boulevard, the "Volkskammer" parliament building of the former (East) German Democratic Republic.

Registration will take place in the Congress Center of the Palast Hotel, which also houses the Information Market and most of the conference sessions. A number of sessions will be held on the premises of the Humboldt University, just a few steps from the Palast Hotel. The Technical University, the Free University and the "Fachhochschulen" of Berlin with its city-wide student population of well over 120,000 will also be integrated into the conference program, though not program sites.

Apart from these main venues, four famous historical buildings in the old center of Berlin are planned to provide additional atmosphere for the conference:

Berlin's Rotes Rathaus (Red City Hall), a short walk from the conference hotel, will accommodate the reception on the evening of the first day, November 3. For the Annual Lunch, November 4, the site is planned to be the Kronprinzenpalais (Palace of the Crown Prince) on Unter den Linden, intended to be the future residence of the President of the Federal Republic of Germany. The closing events are to take place in the immediate vicinity: the Komische Oper (Comic Opera) as the venue for the joint plenary of the CIEE and the European Association for International Education (EAIE) on Thursday afternoon, November 5; the Zeughaus-Museum (City Arsenal), Unter den Linden, as the site for the joint gala reception of CIEE and EAIE in the evening of the same day.

ACCOMMODATION

Participants will be housed at special rates in the Palast Hotel and in other hotels in the immediate vicinity. Rates range from 105 DM to 255 DM for a single, and from 150 DM to 305 DM for a double room. More information and hotel booking forms will be sent out together with the conference registration forms.

PROGRAM

The conference will start on Tuesday, November 3, with the keynote speech by Robert Woodbury, Chancellor of the University of Maine System and Chairman of the Board of CIEE, outlining the areas of concern and targets of the conference. More than 40 concurrent and plenary sessions will follow until Thursday afternoon.

Mundane and practical issues of international educational exchange such as curriculum development, methodology, finances, and structures of exchange will be subjects of discussion as well as the fundamental problems of mass and elite education, the consequences of localization versus globalization in Higher Education, or the experiences with national, regional and minority approaches.

There will be a series of sessions on regional themes covering, especially, Central and Eastern Europe including the former USSR, North America, Africa, and Asia, as well as topical series on language issues or underrepresented groups in international educational exchange, for example.

The program will start with a morning of pre-conference presentations on Tuesday, November 3, on the CIEE and its range of services to the academic community, and on the current European Community schemes in Higher Education (ERASMUS, TEMPUS, etc.).

The joint sessions with the European Association for International Education on Thursday, November 5, will cover the themes "East-West Cooperation", "Bridges to Latin America", "Planning for Increased North American Mobility", and "Internationalization as part of Universities' Strategy Formation". The closing speech on the same day will highlight the main theme of the conference once again: "Cooperating in Education in a Changing World" in and outside of Europe, between nations, regions and continents, and between different levels of the educational systems.

BERLIN

The conference will take place in Berlin, one of the most symbolic points for the historical changes of the recent past, and a city within easy reach of all parts of Western and, especially, Eastern Europe from where many participants are expected.

All conference venues are in the historic center of Berlin in the area between the Brandenburg Gate and Alexanderplatz, connected by the boulevard Unter den Linden and the Karl-Liebknecht-Straße. A walk through this center provides interesting views of Berlin's history and its present endeavors again to become one of the principal cities of the world. A special series of excursions and study-visits around the conference will be offered through a Berlin-based tour agency in order to help delegates and spouses explore the rich cultural heritage of the city and its surroundings.

Immediately following and closely linked to the CIEE conference with joint sessions on November 5 will be the 4th Annual Conference of the European Association for International Education (EAIE), running from 5 - 7 November, also at the Palast Hotel.

This conference bearing the title "The Atlantic Link", will, among many other important issues in international education, concentrate on cooperation and exchange in Higher Education between Europe and America. For the combined CIEE and EAIE conferences more than 1,200 participants, professionals in the field of international educational exchange, key university administrators, educators, and government representatives from all parts of the world are expected.

The conferences are proud to enjoy the support of the Commission of the European Community, The European Cultural Foundation, and the Senate of the City of Berlin.

To facilitate taking maximum advantage of the full range of both conferences, joint registration at special conditions is being offered by the CIEE through its U.S. office in New York and its German office in Bonn.
