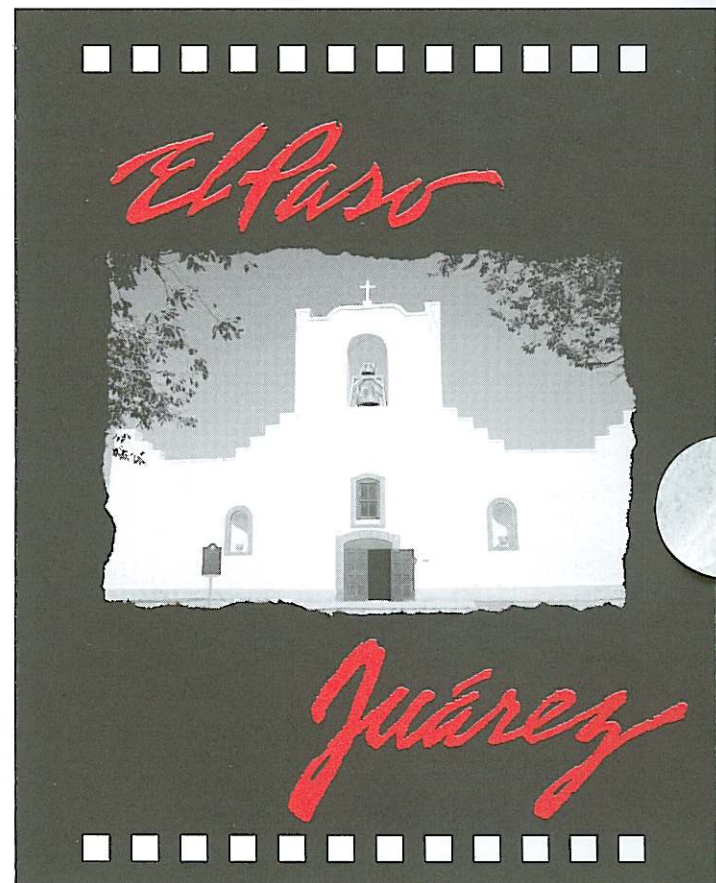

Council's 48th International Conference on Educational Exchange will be held November 8–10, 1995 in the communities of El Paso, Texas in the United States and Juárez, Chihuahua in Mexico. With more than 2.5 million people, the two cities, which are divided by the narrow Rio Grande, comprise the world's largest binational metropolitan area.

The conference, which will be chaired by Alvaro Romo de la Rosa, Coordinator of International Programs, University of Houston System, will launch a process of creating a new agenda and setting priorities for Council, and the field at large.

The conference program will focus attention on six distinct spheres of activity in educational exchange, with the intended goal of identifying the major issues, problems, and opportunities in those spheres in order to create new paradigms for exchange activity in those areas. The six spheres of activity are the following:

- Undergraduate Study Abroad
- Community Colleges and Education Abroad
- Graduate Education and Study Abroad
- International Experiential Education
- Education Abroad and the Secondary School Student
- Internationalizing the Faculty

The results of these discussions and explorations will be the first stage in the process of creating the new agenda. The conference will be the first in a three-year series that will culminate with the organization's 50th Anniversary Conference in November 1997.

In addition to addressing the conference theme, "Creating a New Agenda," sessions at the conference will continue the process of fostering cooperation in educational exchange in North America, with extensive participa-

tion of Canadian and Mexican institutions of higher education. The conference will also continue to explore issues of underrepresentation and diversity and will make extensive use of local resources and opportunities in the communities of Juárez and El Paso, including conference sessions on the campuses of the University of Texas at El Paso and the Universidad Autónoma de Ciudad Juárez. The conference site will be the Camino Real Hotel, El Paso, Texas.

Call for Presentations

The conference organizers are soliciting submissions of proposals for presentation at the conference. Proposals should focus on the six distinct spheres listed above. The conference organizers are particularly interested in proposals that challenge the status quo and that constitute new approaches to these areas. Proposals may be either for individual presentations in larger panels or for complete panels. The conference organizers will also consider submissions regarding other topics.
