The concept of Global Citizenship no doubt has many interpretations. Under this general rubric can be incorporated issues related to business, cultural awareness, politics and economics, and many other features of what Council calls our "globally interdependent and culturally diverse world."

As we look forward to our November 1998 meeting in Boston, Council seeks the advice and participation of colleagues around the world in focusing on aspects of this theme that will be useful for international educators at all levels.

What does Global Citizenship mean to you? How can we best prepare our students to be both successful participants in the society that our mission statement envisions, and effective contributors to a better world?

In particular, the conference organizers are soliciting proposals for presentation at the Boston meeting. While we welcome proposals for sessions based on Council's familiar format—seventy-five minutes; two or three speakers with time for questions at the end—we are also very interested in proposals based on alternative formats, such as the following:

- Three brief position papers (ten minutes each) with forty-five minutes for discussion.
- Paper(s) circulated in advance with the entire session dedicated to discussion.
- Panel discussion of an issue with questions from the floor, without prepared remarks.

Proposed sessions may deal with general concepts, issues, problems, solutions, or controversies, but should not be case studies or descriptions of programs on a single campus. As always, we seek diversity in both the subject matters addressed and the presenters themselves.

- Information about session chair and possible presenters
