

Instructions for the University of Cape Town's Application Form

Please read these instructions before completing the application form.

- 1) Please complete UCT's additional application form and send it to CIEE's home office (7 Custom House St. 3rd Floor, Portland, ME 04101). Despite the instructions on their application form, it should **not** be submitted directly to their International Academic Programmes Office (IAPO). If you do send it to IAPO instead of or in addition to CIEE, it will delay the application and visa process for you. This form **cannot** be submitted to CIEE electronically as UCT requires original signatures on the form.
- 2) This application form serves as your course pre-registration form. If you are applying to our Service-Learning program at the University of Cape Town, please list the following courses in **Section B** of the application form.
 - a. Understanding Cape Town: A Sociological Approach AFST 3001 CTSL
 - b. Social Research Methods Lectures SOCI 3001 CTSL
 - c. Service-Learning Capstone Project INDE 3003 CTSL
 - d. (List either Xhosa Language or Afrikaans Language)
- 3) At the bottom of the second page you are required to provide your original signature in **BLUE** ink. If you are under 21 years-old at the time you are applying for this program, then a parent or legal guardian must also provide their original signature in **BLUE** ink. If you will be 21 by the time you arrive on-site but are under 21 when you are completing the form, then an original signature is **required** of your parent or legal guardian. As UCT requires original signatures from both the student and parent/legal guardian, this form cannot be faxed or e-mailed to CIEE. You may submit two completed UCT applications, one with your original signature and the second with the original signature of you parent or legal guardian, if you do not reside near your parents.
