### **Tour of Barrio de Santa Cruz – Wednesday, June 7**

This Wednesday, we'll tour the charming Santa Cruz neighborhood, Seville's Old Jewish Quarter. It was during the reign of Pedro I that Seville's Jewish community reached its greatest splendor. Indeed, many prominent 14th century Jewish traders called Seville home. Join us for a very interesting walking tour that will open your eyes to an important part of Seville's past. If you want to go, you'll need to sign up in the Office of Student Services, (aula Almería) before 12:30pm on Thursday. We'll meet for the tour in the Plaza del Triunfo (in front of the Giralda), 7:30pm.
