Daytrip to CADIZ
Sample Itinerary



Saturday

9am **Departure from Puerta de Derecho** (Universidad de Sevilla).

10:30am **Arrival in Cadiz.** Brief introduction to the city history at **Puerta de Tierra** (old entrance to the town). Then, we'll start **a walking tour of the old city: Palacio de Congresos** (old tobacco factory), **Plaza de San Juan de Dios (City Hall), Roman Theater, Barrio del Pópulo and Cathedral** (we'll go up the **Torre de Poniente** to enjoy the city views).

* **We will have 15 minutes of free time before the visit to the Cathedral for coffee, toilets, etc.**

12pm We will continue the **walking tour of the old city: plaza de las Flores, plaza del Mercado** (local market), **calle Ancha, plaza de San Antonio, plaza Mina, Alameda Apodaca, parque Genovés** and the **Caleta beach**.

2pm **Free time for LUNCH.** If you don't have a "bocadillo", we suggest to go to one of these restaurants:

Freiduría las Flores – Plaza de las Flores, for fried fish.

El Balandro – Alameda Apodaca, 22. Good tapas, good views and nice atmosphere.

Bares (Zorrilla street) – The cheapest area to try local food.

Bar La gorda te da de comer – c/General Luque, 1.

Some suggestions for your free time:

Explore el Mercado and the Plaza la Flores. If you go the market, be sure to visit the *kiosco* of "El Melli." There, you'll find thousands of CDs with songs from the Carnaval de Cadiz. Buy a CD and listen to it at home. If you can understand the words...you're a real *andaluz!*

Cadiz Museum (Plaza de Mina). There are three different sections: Archeology, Fine Arts and Ethnography. It's famous for its collection of Andalusian Impressionism. Free admission with your student card. Tel: 956 20 33 68.

Tavira Tower – This tower has a dark room and mirrors, where you can see real-time images of all parts of the city. 2.80€ with your student card. Open until 6 pm. C/Sacramento, on the corner of C/ Marqués del Real Tesoro (near the market). Tel: 956 212 910.

Enjoy the beach – You can go to Victoria beach or Caleta beach. Caleta is closer but it's much smaller and crowded.

Visit to the Santa Catalina Castle: This fortress, placed in the Caleta beach, was built by Philip II, King of Spain. Open until 6 pm.

5:30pm Departure from Cádiz. We'll depart from the Puerta del Castillo de Santa Catalina (Caleta Beach).

7pm Arrival in Seville.

Rules for the Trip

- Your guide is there to inform and help you. Please give them your undivided attention and respect.
- Be on time, especially when we take the bus. If you are not there at the prescribed hour, don't be surprised if the bus leaves without you. To rejoin the group, you'll need to arrange for your own transportation.
