



A Summer Study Abroad Program for Diverse Student Leaders

The Frederick Douglass Global Fellowship is a summer study abroad program designed for students of color, as part of CIEE's commitment to open doors to students from underrepresented backgrounds. The program explores the impact that effective leaders have had on social justice movements and critical peace and conflict resolution efforts around the world.

During the four-week summer program, Fellows will travel to Washington, DC, Cape Town, Dublin, Derry, and Belfast to explore the legacies of Frederick Douglass, Abraham Lincoln, John Lewis, Nelson Mandela, Bishop Desmond Tutu, Daniel O'Connell, John Hume, and other giants of social change.

**Students not selected as fellows that meet the eligibility requirements are guaranteed a \$1,500 grant to a summer 2023, fall 2023, spring 2024, or summer 2024 CIEE study abroad program.

Eligibility Requirements

- Current undergraduate freshman, sophomore or junior
Minimum GPA of 3.3
- U.S. citizen, U.S. national or permanent resident
- Identify as an ethnicity typically underrepresented on study abroad programs (e.g. American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian, Black/African American, Hispanic/Latino or Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander).
- Submit your application by the February 14, 2023 deadline
