Some CIEE Work & Travel USA employers offer housing for students. If your employer offers housing, you will be informed of that when you are hired. If they do not offer housing, your employer can still help by recommending places to stay.

THERE ARE TWO KINDS OF HOUSING:

- Short-term housing: A temporary place to stay while you look for long-term housing.
- Long-term housing: An apartment or house to rent on a long-term basis, often shared with other CIEE Work & Travel USA students. It is a good idea to look for long-term housing before you arrive in the U.S.

A Place to Stay When You First Arrive

It is very important to arrange for short-term accommodations before you leave for the United States. Depending on your final destination, you might need to find more than one place as you travel to your final destination.
